**RCMP Zoom** Ches gave an overview of the RCMP Zoom meeting he attended. We

currently have 5 vacancies in the B.P. detachment with 2 of those on sick

leave and 3 positions not filled. There has been no increase in the Provincial budget since 2010. To police the area accurately, we should

have 26 officers in the area and we currently only have 21. The RCMP are looking for support from the local municipalities. They request councils

bring up this topic to the newly elected MHA in each area.

## **Asset Plan**

Ches gave an overview of the Zoom meeting with Tract Consulting. They are hoping to have a visit in March to map out the water line and curb stops as well as other infrastructures. They hope to have the project completed by August. Ches has since sent some information so they can get started.
